## JAMESTOWN SETTLEMENT

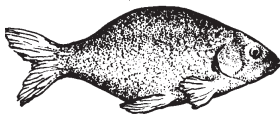
### 4 to 6 Year-Olds

Go fishing for information about what the Powhatan Indians caught in their traps and nets in the James River. You

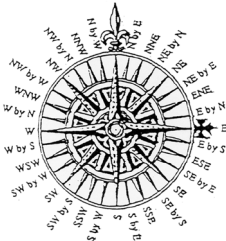


will craft your own "catch of the day" to bring home.

### HEAVE HO!

Set your sights for Virginia as you train to be part of the ship's crew. Sails, lines and bells all are part of the day's adventure, and then you'll make a compass to help you stay on course.

### FLYING FEATHERS

Some feathers fly without the bird – like when they are tossed in an Indian game of skill. Visit the Powhatan village to see where feathers are featured, and then create your own corncob toss game to continue the fun at home.



### TRASH TO TREASURE

What is the value of garbage? For an archaeologist it can be a gold mine of information about the past. Discover what the Jamestown colonists threw away and how the story of their lives can be put back together. A collage of "artifacts" will decorate your own shadow box and remind you of the many things you learned.



### 3rd-5th Grades

New adventures await children who have just completed third, fourth or fifth grade as they participate in programs at Jamestown Settlement. The museum offers a three-day history camp, held from 9:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m., where students explore 17th-century life through exciting activities in the classrooms and outdoor living-history areas.

### Three-day History Program CONSIDER THE SOURCE

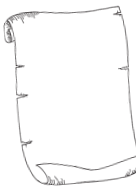
June 22-24, July 21-23, July 29-31  
9:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m.

Participants in this three-day history program at Jamestown Settlement explore the sources of our knowledge about life here 400 years ago. Can you believe everything you read? What can pictures and artifacts tell you? We'll consider primary sources for firsthand evidence during your exciting study of Jamestown.



### Day 1: Star Bright

Learn to use state-of-the-art (for 1607!) mariners' tools as you discover how they found their way from Europe to the New World. The tool you'll make will help you navigate too.



### Day 2: A True Report

Did Virginia Company writings advertise truth or fiction about the new colony? Settlers often were recruited by publicity; even Shakespeare knew of the adventure. Can you create a convincing broadside?

### Day 3: African Arrival

Evidence is growing about the first Africans in Virginia and their culture at home. You will make colorful block print designs like those found on traditional cloth in west central Africa.

# YORKTOWN VICTORY CENTER

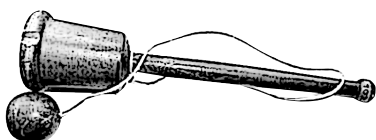
## 4 to 6 Year-Olds

## 3rd-5th Grades

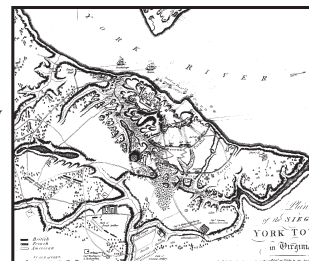

### Two-day History Program

#### TOWN OF YORK

June 25-26, July 7-8, July 27-28  
9:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m.

Discover the bustling seaport town as it was 250 years ago. With merchants' stores, craftsmen's shops, taverns and warehouses, Yorktown was a hub of activity in this area. You'll also find out how it was an important strategic location during the American Revolution.



#### Day 1: Sign of the Times

Where is the best site for the windmill? The tobacco warehouse? Make these decisions as you lay out the town of York on our floor map. Learn how merchants advertised their wares, and create a sign to promote your own prospering business.

#### Day 2: Surrender at Yorktown

Did you know that 2009 marks the 228th anniversary of the last significant military action of the Revolutionary War? Collect evidence for your "lotus book" as you study the strategy behind the Siege of Yorktown.

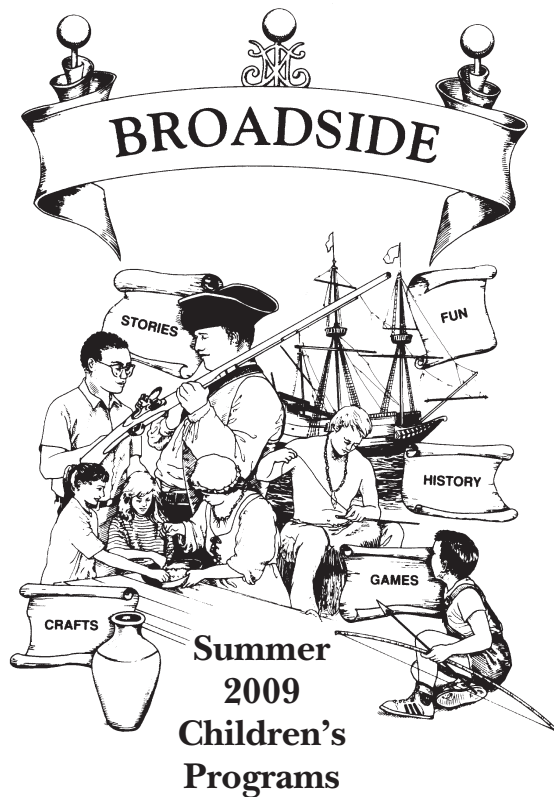

## Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation



Jamestown Settlement, a museum of 17th-century Virginia, evokes the world of America's first permanent English settlement through documentary film, indoor gallery exhibits and outdoor living history.

A dramatic documentary film, *1607: A Nation Takes Root*, and comprehensive gallery exhibits trace Jamestown's beginnings in England and the first century of the Virginia colony, while Jamestown served as its capital, and provide insight into the cultures of the Powhatans, Europeans and Africans who converged in 1600s Virginia.

Outdoors, costumed historical interpreters describe and demonstrate daily life in the early 17th century. Visitors can board replicas of the three ships – *Susan Constant*, *Godspeed* and *Discovery* – that sailed from England to Virginia in 1607, explore life-size re-creations of the colonists' fort and a Powhatan village, and tour a seasonal riverfront discovery area to learn about the important role of waterways in 17th-century travel and commerce.

Jamestown Settlement is located on State Route 31 South near the Colonial Parkway. From Interstate 64, take Exit 242A (Route 199) toward Williamsburg and Jamestown.



At the Yorktown Victory Center, a museum of the American Revolution, America's struggle for independence is chronicled from the beginnings of colonial unrest to the formation of the new nation. The story comes alive through timeline, film, exhibition galleries and outdoor living history.

The "Road to Revolution" open-air walkway and indoor exhibition galleries provide insight into the events that led to conflict between the American colonies and Britain, the war's impact on ordinary men and women, military life, the convergence of forces at Yorktown in 1781, and the creation of the Constitution and Bill of Rights.

An evocative film, *A Time of Revolution*, set in an encampment during the siege, portrays the musings of soldiers about their lives and the war that brought them together.

Outdoors, visitors can experience the Revolution firsthand by joining a cannon crew or learning about 18th-century medical care in a re-created Continental Army encampment. A re-created 1780s farm offers a rare glimpse of how the majority of Virginians lived during the United States' formative years.

The Yorktown Victory Center is located on Route 1020 near the Colonial Parkway in Yorktown. From Interstate 64, take Exit 247 to Yorktown.
